

1 Teaching

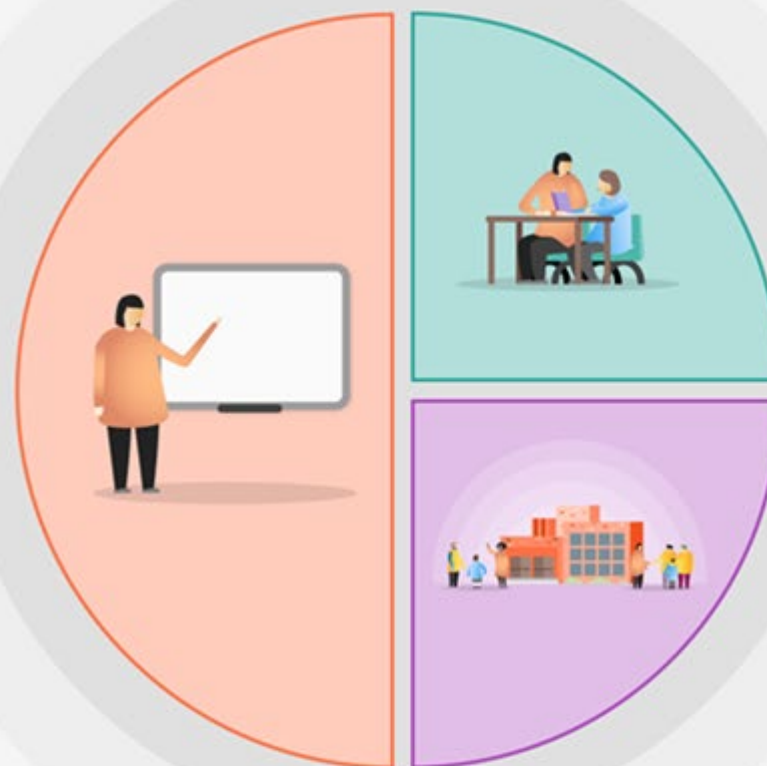
Increased staff training will ensure teaching is the best it can be to help pupils catch up

Implement our recovery curriculum to help pupils catch up:

- Encourage reading in school and reading for pleasure at home. We will buy more books and provide access to e-books / online reading
- Focus on vocabulary development and language acquisition across the school.
- We will also focus on maths. We will continue to teach in school using Maths No Problem. Outside school children will have access to Mathletics and Times Tables Rockstars. Some children in KS2 will have access to an online 1:1 maths tutor.
- Continue our broad and engaging curriculum, which allows children to apply basic skills across the curriculum (with a reading focus).
- Regular low-pressure quizzes to check pupils are making progress and catching up.

We are leading all LST primary schools in creating our digital learning system. Children and parents will quickly learn how to use Tapestry (EY & KS1) and Google Classroom (KS2) for online learning

We have over 200 Chromebooks (laptops) to use in school and lend to families who have limited technology at home.



2 Targeted academic support

We have additional groups set up to teach extra phonics and reading lessons in across the school

We have extra tutors and tuition (during and after school) to help children catch up.

We will continue to use online tutoring (e.g. 3rd Space learning) to address lost learning in maths.

For children with specialist needs, we will continue to work with external professionals to ensure those pupils get the support they need.

We are enrolling in government led and supported programmes (e.g. Oak Academy) to help pupils catch up.

3 Wider strategies

We are focussed on our children's wellbeing: we have surveyed pupils to check mental wellbeing and PSHE lessons focus on this too.

We have very clear routines in school for the children. Our premises are COVID secure.

Our Welfare team are your first point of contact for support. They will be in contact with children and families who are not in school.

Our Welfare Team will also ensure our most vulnerable and needy families have access to classroom teaching & online materials.

Food parcels are available for children entitled to free school meals who have to self-isolate.

Where possible, we still offer clubs for children.
